
Jamestown Area Grief Support Team is offering a Grief Support

Thank you to our staff, Pastor Linda, Steve, Leann and Michelle for all you do!! Easter blessings, Tory




My name is **Steven Schultz** but to many I'm probably best known as the man at the back of the church in the sound booth.

- ◆ 1 lightweight bath towel—dark color preferred, up to 52"X27"
  - 1 adult-sized toothbrush
  - ◆ 1 sturdy comb—no picks
- ◆ 1 nail clipper—file optional
- ♦ 2 bars of soap—4 oz.
